

**Steven M. Hilton, President and Chief Executive Officer**

Steven Hilton, grandson of the late hotel entrepreneur who created the Conrad N. Hilton Foundation, has worked in the field of philanthropy for more than 25 years. Steven Hilton joined the Foundation in 1983 and has held numerous positions over the years, including Program Assistant, Program Associate, and Vice President, Programs. He was named President in 1998 and in 2005 the board of directors also appointed him CEO. Hilton oversees an annual grantmaking budget of approximately \$90 million. Most of the Foundation's grants are applied to long-term projects such as safe water development in Africa and other countries; early childhood development for disabled babies and toddlers; youth substance abuse prevention; housing for the homeless, including mentally ill and mothers with children; worldwide blindness prevention and services; and support for the work of Catholic Sisters. Prior to joining the Foundation, Hilton worked for five years in hotel management in Alabama, Georgia and California with the Hilton Hotels Corporation. He was also involved in aquaculture (fish farming) businesses in California and Hawaii. A graduate of the University of California at Santa Barbara, Hilton earned his Masters of Business Administration (MBA) degree from the University of California at Los Angeles (UCLA). Hilton serves on the boards of both the Foundation and the Conrad N. Hilton Fund.

**Judy M. Miller, Vice President, Conrad N. Hilton Foundation and Director, Conrad N. Hilton Humanitarian Prize and Symposia**

Judy Miller oversees all aspects of the Hilton Humanitarian Prize, from the nomination process to the final selection by an international panel of jurors. She is responsible for planning and executing the annual Hilton international humanitarian symposia and also supervises the foundation's communications. Miller has more than 35 years experience working in both the corporate and nonprofit sectors, specializing in public relations, international marketing, and government affairs. Prior to joining the Hilton Foundation in 1997, Miller helped establish and manage for seven years a national nonprofit organization combating alcohol abuse in the United States. Before that, she was Executive Vice President, Marketing, of a national public relations and business consulting firm and for 15 years implemented communications strategies for corporations, foundations, and government agencies. In the 1970s, Miller was the first female to hold an executive position in a major Japanese corporation, Suntory Limited, representing its interests in all English-speaking countries for 15 years. Miller was appointed Commissioner of the Los Angeles Department of Water & Power, the world's largest municipal utility and served from 1993 to 2001. She is a founding director of Children Now, serves on the board of the Foundation for American Communications, and is a member of the Pacific Council on International Policy and the International Women's Forum, a global network of women leaders in 21 countries.

**Princess Salimah Aga Khan, International Ambassador for SOS-Kinderdorf International**

Princess Salimah Aga Khan was born in New Delhi, and grew up in India where her father served in the British army from 1918 to 1947. In 1969 she married His Highness, the Aga Khan, spiritual leader of the Ismaili sect of Muslims. In 1995 Their Highnesses decided to separate and since then Princess Salimah Aga Khan has committed herself to supporting various humanitarian efforts, especially those in the areas of health and child support. Princess Salimah Aga Khan started working with SOS Children's Villages when she took part in the official opening of the first SOS Children's Village in French Polynesia. Being a resident of Switzerland, a close relationship developed with the Swiss SOS Children's Village association and she was named, special ambassador of the Swiss Friends of the SOS Children's Villages. In 2000 Princess Salimah Aga Khan was officially appointed as the first SOS-Kinderdorf International Ambassador. Princess Salimah Aga Khan has visited SOS Children's facilities in Cambodia, Nepal, Romania, France, Egypt, India, Austria, South Africa and Pakistan.
